After the first round of games, the team had managed to get themselves into a good position; they then played a final game, eventually taking the silver medal. What a wonderful achievement.

Wise Bytes No. 5 - How can we protect our children from grooming and sexual abuse online?

Find a good time and place to start conversations with your child about internet use and safety.

https://www.thinkuknow.co.uk/ has short videos you can watch together as well as plenty of guidance for parents and carers.

Be careful with live streaming apps - children often do things in the heat of the moment and act on impulse without thinking of the consequences - just like offline. They may share personal information when asked or do things that, in another situation, they wouldn't do, such as share something private or even sexual.

Children like to have lots of friends and followers online, but they risk unwanted adult attention if they accept friend requests from people they don't know.

It might feel awkward to have these conversations, but your children will listen to you if you take the time and courage to broach these subjects.
