

The Governors at The Blake School are a well informed and committed group of twelve volunteers who work as a team to-

Ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;

Hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff;

Oversee the financial performance of the school, making sure its money is well spent.

As part of the Oxford Diocesan Schools Trust (ODST) the work of the governing board is supported by the Directors of ODST. The Directors have delegated many responsibilities to the governors, if you want to read more about this you can do so [here](#).

The governors work closely with Mr Edwards-Grundy and other members of the staff team; they routinely visit school to monitor the implementation of the school's strategic priorities. Governors receive training and support from ODST and the Diocese to help them fulfil their role effectively.

Meetings of the full governing board take place about six times a year, meeting in different classrooms in order to see the work that is being displayed and get a feel for what is going on in the school.


There is huge variety to the work of the governors and so where necessary they also meet in smaller groups/committees.







The Finance committee has responsibility for the in-depth scrutiny of the school's finances; their meetings are attended by the School Business Manager. Governors are involved in the recruitment of staff, decisions regarding staff pay and they look at any staffing/personnel matters.

The Admissions committee consists of any three members of the Governing Board, they meet once a term to discuss any in-year applications for places at the school.
