

## Governor Newsletter July 2017



During Term 6 the governors ask all of the children in Year 6 to complete a survey reflecting on their time at The Blake School.

The feedback from the survey is really useful to governors; the detailed results have been fed back to the Year 6 children.

When asked for their favourite memories of their time at The Blake School the residential trips in Year 4 and 6 were clear winners!

School performances, sports events, trips and good friends also featured very highly on the children's list of favourite things.

The vast majority of children said that they feel The Blake School is a safe place to be.

They also told us that there is someone at The Blake School to whom they can go for help if they are worried or have a problem.

Almost all of the Year 6 children think that the children at The Blake School are mostly trying to behave according to the school values.

The vast majority of children feel that The Blake School has helped prepare them for their new school, it was lovely to read how they feel being at The Blake school has taught them courage, perseverance and how to work as a team as well as giving them increased self-confidence

The children also gave us some good ideas of things that they feel would make The Blake School even better. The governors will be looking at these in the next academic year, although a swimming pool in the grounds may not be achievable!

At their last meeting, the governors bade farewell to Gill Pagliuca.

Gill has been a foundation governor for seven years during which time she has also been Vice-Chair, committee chair, had responsibilities relating to health and safety and been the link governor for maths and science!

In the autumn, the governors will introduce you to the new foundation governor who will be appointed in Gill's place. The appointment will be made on the recommendation of the PCC at St Mary's Cogges and following a formal appointment process by the Oxford Diocesan Schools Trust.

The governors will be reviewing their roles and structure for the new academic year in order to fill the gaps left by Gill!
