Our school vision

This term, governors held an extraordinary governing body meeting in order to consider all the feedback that had been received from stakeholders regarding the recrystallizing of the school vision.

School Development Priorities

Over the year the governors have been monitoring progress against the school's identified development priorities. At their last two meetings governors reflected on the impact of the school's work in relation to each of the priorities.

In June, the governors began to think about the development priorities for 2019/20. More information about the priorities will be shared with parents at the start of next year but the three areas of focus will be: ensuring clear skills progression in all subjects throughout the school, supporting staff development / embedding the coaching culture and developing the breadth of the RE curriculum.

Health and Safety

Every year the school is inspected by a member of the Local Authority Health and Safety team. A thorough audit of both paperwork and the site is carried out and a detailed report produced detailing actions to be undertaken.

As in previous years, the inspector endorsed the very high standards of health and safety maintained in all areas of school life.
