This week we have finished reflecting on Peace, our Value for June. In Collective Worship on Monday we thought together about the things that we can do to give us peace. The children had lots of ideas. We talked about the wonder of nature and how spending time outside can give us peace, and we thought about how hobbies, challenging ourselves, and being with friends can all give us a deep sense of peace.

As we thought about what the Bible has to say about peace we read a passage from Philippians 4 –

‘Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.’

We know that there are lots of things that can rob us of peace. Our home circumstances, concerns about spiralling costs, world news and ill-health to name just a few. Children too can easily become anxious. As term comes towards a close and conversations around teachers for next year, or moving on to a new setting, occupy playtime chatter, it is easy to understand why children do not always feel peaceful.

As a staff team we are committed to putting in place as much support as we can to help children manage their anxieties, to dealing openly and honestly with their hard questions and to supporting them through their challenges. If your child is ever experiencing particular anxiety, please do catch their class teacher and share this with them.

On Monday, I encouraged both your children and the staff team, to think about ways in which they can help themselves to be peaceful. Perhaps you can take some family time this weekend to do some things together that will help you all feel peaceful?

As the end of the academic year draws closer, children have lots of events coming up in their classes that we hope will celebrate all that they have achieved this year. Please do come and support our sports events if you are able, it will be wonderful to have our community back on site on those two dates. We are also looking forward to seeing our Year 6 children perform to the school and later to their parents.

Have a wonderful weekend. I pray that you will enjoy finding ways that together with your children will help you to experience peace.
