# Year 6 Curriculum Overview - Terms 1 and 2

Over the next two terms we will be covering the following areas in our curriculum:

#### **English**

Our writing focuses are...

book, 'The Promise' and writing setting descriptions about how the mean city turns into a beautiful place to live. We will be aiming to include our own figurative language ideas in the style of the author. War Horse: We will read this text by Michael Morpurgo as a class, exploring its characters and themes in depth. We will write letters to characters, re-write parts of the story from different character's points of view and explore the author's use of language. We will also develop our descriptive writing through this text.

The Promise: We will start the year exploring the

**Biography writing:** We will be finding out all about the features of biographies and non-fiction writing. We will be finding out about Walter Tull's life and creating our own biographies.

This term will also include:

- Individual, shared and guided reading. In guided reading, our focus text is 'Holes' by Louis Sachar.
- Ongoing spelling and grammar work.

#### Science

Our topics are 'Light' and 'Evolution and Inheritance'. In 'Light' we will be exploring how light travels in straight lines, how we see objects, reflection and how shadows are formed. During our topic of 'Evolution and Inheritance' we will be looking at how fossils give us evidence of evolution and how animals and plants have adapted and evolved over time. We will also recognise that animals produce offspring of the same kind and explore traits that are inherited and variations that occur.

#### **Maths**

We will continue with Number Club to practise and learn our times tables and division facts.

#### **Number: Place Value**

- Securing the place value of numbers to tens of millions, including decimal place value
- Read, write, order, and compare numbers to tens of millions
- Rounding numbers to any degree of accuracy
- Understanding negative numbers in different contexts

## Calculation: Four Operations $(+, -, x, \div)$

- Securing the use of the formal methods of calculation for all four operations
- Practise of the four operations within arithmetic and applying to reasoning problems
- Developing mental calculation strategies and applying these to arithmetic, reasoning and problem-solving questions
- Developing our understanding of prime, squared and cubed numbers, and multiples and factors

## **Fractions:**

- Securing our understanding of equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions, improper fractions and mixed numbers
- Comparing and ordering
- Calculating with fractions using the four operations

# **Geometry: Position and Direction**

Four quadrant coordinates, translations and reflections.

This term will also include:

- Daily morning maths covering various aspects of mathematics.
- A weekly arithmetic focus to enhance fluency.

## **Art and DT**

**Art** – We will start the year by looking at 'Pop Art' and exploring the work of Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein. We will then link this to graffiti and explore the question, 'Is graffiti art?'

We will explore the work of a modern artist and illustrator, Elise Gravel, linking her work to our World War 1 topic. We will create our own 'Remembrance art' and focus on our sketching skills and drawing faces, using WW1 soldiers as our subject. We will also link Art and poetry in the form of 'black out poetry'.

**DT** – We will be designing and making shoe box trenches linked to our World War 1 topic. We will link this to our history learning by discovering the different elements of a trench and their uses. We will then look at how to model these using different materials for our own models.

## **History/Geography**

We will learn about Word War One.

- We will learn about how WW1 began, which countries were involved and the alliances that were formed.
- We will locate the countries involved on a map and their associated alliances.
- We will learn to use primary and secondary sources to explore what life was like in the trenches and the events surrounding 'The Christmas Truce'.
- We will link our English biography writing by researching Walter Tull and his experiences of World War 1.

## PΕ

**Outdoor PE - Invasion games.** We will focus on developing our skills within netball, basketball and hockey.

#### Music

We have a new, exciting scheme to follow for our music teaching called 'Charanga'. In Term 1, our unit is 'Happy', and all the learning is focused around one song: Happy by Pharrell Williams. In Term 2, the unit 'Classroom Jazz 2' will explore listening and appraising opportunities to two main tunes. We will develop our skills of playing instruments and improvising.

#### RE

Our big question for Term 1 is 'Is the Bible helpful?' During Term 2 we will explore 'Is 'God becomes Man' a good way to understand the Christmas story?

- Developing Word processing skills.
- Internet and E-Safety.

Our units in French will be 'Actions' and 'In France'. We will be revising vocabulary relating to greetings, numbers, colours and family.
