I asked the children to think about the things or the people that give them courage. Time and time again the children responded that it was you, their parents, that help them and give them courage to keep going when things are tough, to try new things, to persevere and have another go and to act courageously even when that is hard to do.

As I reflected to myself afterwards, whilst your children draw strength from you, you also need courage to be parents, to look after your children, to support them and to steer them through the many ups and downs of childhood. Parenting takes a lot of courage, it is a tough gig! As we have reflected before, and did so in Collective Worship this week, though we each show the Values and they are a decision that each of us have to make as an individual, they are very much community things too. It is hard to be courageous on your own and almost impossible to be a parent on your own, we need the support and encouragement of one another.

This weekend, whatever the challenges you face, wherever you need courage, I would encourage you to draw strength from the people around you and wherever you are successful and your courage holds

– celebrate!
