
#### News from around the school

Alongside this newsletter you will receive a copy of our Relationships and Sex Education Policy, which we have updated in the light of new government guidance.


The new guidance requires us to consult on this policy. If you would like to ask any questions about this curriculum area, please do get in touch with us.
