

## Governor Newsletter June 2019



During May the clerk to the governors spent time in school, talking to groups of children about what it is like to be a pupil at The Blake School.

84 children, with six representatives from every class in the school, chatted, drew pictures and wrote to give governors a really good picture of life at The Blake School.

"We are looked after."

"I like making things in the craft area."

The children also talked about some of the things they can find harder in school and shared their ideas for what would make the school an even better place.

"I would like more school trips."

"We need a rules enforcer for when we play 4 square."

The governors will be talking to staff about these things and all the other ideas that the children shared, considering how they may be best addressed. Next year the governors will feed back to the children which of their ideas they have been able to address.

As part of the governors' intention to seek the views of all stakeholders regarding the school vision, the children were also asked to talk about they already value about the school / what makes it special and if they had ten words to describe the school what would they be.

The children came up with a whopping 73 different adjectives to describe The Blake School with almost half describing it as "fun". Other words in the top ten were amazing, friendly, kind, lovely, happy, safe, good, special and exciting.

When thinking about the things that make The Blake School special for them the children commented on the teachers, their friends, their learning, special events, the school's ethos, sports events, playtimes and behaviour.
