Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Year 1: Curriculum Letter 2022/23

We would like to extend a warm welcome to all our Year 1 families! We have been so impressed with how your children have settled into Year 1 and are looking forward to a happy and successful year together. We hope this letter will provide lots of important information about Year 1 but please do ask if there are questions left unanswered.

The Year 1 Team

1DF: Mrs Fuller (Class Teacher), Mrs Squire and Mrs Sollis (Teaching Assistants) Mrs Rowlands teaches 1DF on a Wednesday morning and 1KH on a Thursday morning. Your child may be taught by any members of the Year 1 team at different points in the year, particularly for Phonics.

Times of the School Day

We open our doors at 8:55am and enjoy welcoming your children individually into the classroom. The doors are locked at 9.05am, after which please make your way to the school office. Break time is from 10.20am - 10.40am, when the children will have a morning snack. The children go into the hall to eat their lunch at 11:50am, followed by a lunchtime play outside, which finishes at 1:00pm. They then have an afternoon break and snack at 2:45pm and the school day finishes at 3.15pm.

Snacks and Water

The children have two opportunities for a snack in the school day, once in the morning and once in the afternoon. The majority of children bring in a snack from home for the morning and then have a fruit snack provided by the school in the afternoon. Please ensure snacks are

brought in a named pot or box. Snacks must be healthy and must not contain any nuts. We suggest fresh fruit or vegetables, but your child may also bring in a cereal bar, crackers or cheese if they prefer. No crisps, sweets or chocolate. Children must also bring in a named water bottle, which they can access and refill throughout the day.

Collective Worship

During the week we have an act of worship every day. On a Monday and Friday, this is in the school hall with the rest of the school. We end each day with a reflection time and the school prayer.

Curriculum

Please find attached an overview of our curriculum for Terms 1 and 2, taking us up until Christmas. You will receive another letter at the start of Terms 3 and 5 to outline the curriculum for these terms. Our main topics this term are 'All about Me', 'Terrific Toys' and 'Christmas', all of which will provide your children with exciting learning opportunities while ensuring key Year 1 learning objectives are met.

PE

Our PE slot for the week is a Friday afternoon. Please ensure PE kits are in school on this day. It is <u>essential</u> that all PE kit items are clearly named! Long hair needs to be tied back for PE and earrings need to be removed. If your child is wearing tights, please ensure they have socks in their PE bag. If there is a medical reason why your child cannot take part one week, please let us know.

We also enjoy 'Wake and Shake' and 'Movement Breaks' throughout the school day, providing regular opportunities for exercise and wherever the weather allows, children will have learning time outside in the Year 1 garden.

Reading

Reading is an essential part of the Year 1 curriculum. While we read throughout the week during Phonics lessons, we aim to read with your child individually once a week. This may be with either with your child's teacher, a Teaching Assistant or a volunteer reader. This will be recorded in their Reading Diaries.

Reading with your child at home is essential for their reading development and confidence. We appreciate your support with this and would encourage you to ask questions and discuss the stories, to help develop their comprehension and enhance their enjoyment of their reading. We recommend reading with your child for at least 10 minutes every day. Please record this in their Reading Diary.

Reading Books

Each week, your child will come home with a decodable book which your child should be able to read to you using their phonics skills (sounding out unknown words). Your child should aim to read this book three times before changing it. The first read will be decoding and slower, the second read should be more fluent and the third read they should be adding expression. When the book has been read three times, they can change their book for a new one. This can either be during their reading time with an adult, or if they need their book changing sooner, please let us know on the door in the morning.

Your child will also come home with a book of their choice from the library. This book is to encourage your child's love of reading and expose them to a range of rich vocabulary. Depending on your child's reading level, you may read this with or to your child and enjoy the story together.

We very much look forward to a happy and learning-filled year with your children. If you have any questions about the curriculum or any other aspect of life in Year 1, please do ask!

Use our knowledge of sounds to read real and non-real ('alien') words. Year 1 Curriculum Overview – Terms 1 and 2

Every day, we have a class story time in which we read, explore and discuss a high quality picture book. Writing Our writing will be taught through the Read, Write, Inc. Phonics programme. During our sessions, we will read decodable books together and will practise our writing skills based on the book. This gives context, inspiration and purpose for writing. Our sessions will focus on using our phonics skills to sound out and write words, as well as developing the use of capital letters and full stops, and using the correct letter formation and finger spaces.
