

This week it was our great pleasure to welcome members of the team from St Mary's Cogges to our Collective Worship. Ruth, Rachel and Simon led us in thinking about our new Value of the Month, Forgiveness and we had lots of fun!

We started by thinking about the parable of the Unforgiving Servant. In this story that Jesus told, a man is forgiven a huge debt, one that he would never be able to pay. That forgiven man however then refuses to forgive a much smaller debt that is owed to him.

Together we thought about what it means to be forgiven and to forgive others and we each had time to remember occasions where we have been forgiven and also where we have been slow to forgive. Simon showed us a powerful image of a sculpture outside of Coventry Cathedral. The sculpture is a good visual example of what it means to forgive and to put something right when it has gone wrong. Like a bridge, the sculpture would collapse if one person or the other did not play their part.



That sculpture led us into a wonderful bridge building race of children against staff as we thought about how forgiveness builds bridges.







Whilst the game was **a lot** of fun, it helped us all think about something quite difficult – how forgiveness can be hard work and requires all of us to play our part. Do ask your children about Collective Worship and who they were supporting in the bridge building race!

It has been wonderful to welcome many of you into school this week to buy books from the travelling book fair. I am delighted that your children have such a passion for reading. Your purchases will result in us being given more books for our school library – thank-you.
