	Windows in shared adult areas are open all around the site to ensure ventilation
	Staff required to maintain social distance in any shared spaces
	Shared equipment sanitised after each user – wherever possible shared resources are not used
Transmission of Covid-19 within bubbles	Wherever possible children have their own resources
	Classrooms are well ventilated, regular opportunities to be outside (in all weathers)
	Cleaning of all frequently touched surfaces and tabletops takes place at lunchtime as well as at the
	end of the day. Cleaning staff limited to specific areas of the school to reduce cross-over.
