Last Friday, I spent the day interviewing candidates for next year. I always love interview days. It is inspiring to hear interviewees talk about why they love teaching and what drives them to seek the best for the children in their care.

One of the candidates asked me what three words I would use to describe The Blake School and I chose –

- Redemption
- Freedom
- Safety

Redemption is so important for all of us because it means that we are not simply stuck with how things are, there is the possibility of change. This change is not only of our circumstances, but also personal growth and transformation. In school, redemption means that every day is a new day, the slate is wiped clean.

After a year of lockdowns, we all long for greater freedom! In school, there is freedom for your children to try new things and to fail, freedom to take risks and freedom learn and flourish.

Safety underpins both redemption and freedom, only when children feel safe can they be free to learn. In school, safety is about the warmth of welcome and the acceptance that there is for your children. Safety is in knowing that you are loved, no matter what.

I know that despite our greatest endeavours and best of intentions we don't always get it right, but each and every member of the staff team is working to make this school the very best it can be.

In Collective Worship this morning I reminded children that when I was in primary school I found reading and writing really hard and it is still something that I have to concentrate hard on. Perseverance is not just something we ask of the children, we all have things that we need to persevere at.

As we seek to live out our values and reflect our ethos, we will all need perseverance. Working together towards our common objectives is what makes us community. Thank you for all that you continue to do as a parent body to work with us and for being part of our very special community.

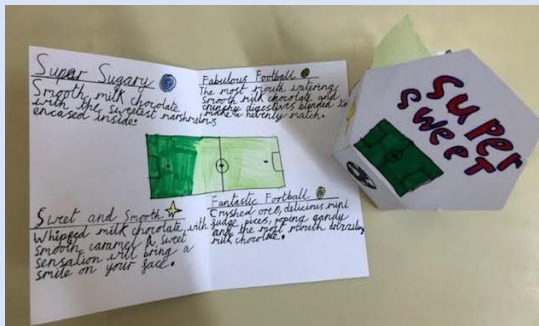
