News from Mr Edwards-Grundy

It has been a joy to welcome your children back into school this week. Walking around the school, it has been wonderful to see smiling children engaging in all kinds of learning.

Our Value of the Month for January is Justice. In Collective Worship we will be thinking about the difference between restorative and punitive justice. Children instinctively understand about justice, they recognise that there must be consequences for actions, but they also desire and practise forgiveness. This week we will be exploring how forgiveness and consequences run side by side, not only in our daily lives, but also in the Bible.

When thinking about justice it is good to start by remembering that we have all been created equal before God and have the right to be treated with dignity and respect. Sometimes, especially when we have been hurt, it is all too easy to lose sight of this essential truth and to focus entirely on punitive justice. Restorative justice is often much harder and focuses instead on dignity, respect and enabling everyone to rebuild and start afresh.

Our Bible verse for this month comes from one of the short and lesser-known books of the Bible, Micah:

"And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Micah 6 verse 8

In Collective Worship during January, we will be returning to this verse time and again. We will be thinking carefully about what acting justly might mean in our relationships at home and in school but also in the much bigger arenas of caring for our world and buying Fairtrade chocolate!

Justice is very complex. It is important for your children to learn, and ourselves as adults to re-learn, that our decisions and actions have consequences. We cannot simply behave as we wish. However, we all also need to learn the importance of forgiveness, of having our mistakes forgotten, and starting anew.

I am really looking forward to considering Justice with your children this month and to exploring and refining my thinking with them about what justice means for us as a school community.
