Learning Focus: I can subtract using numbers up to 10 using the crossing out method (Extension: I can subtract a single digit number from a two-digit number.)

We are continuing our subtraction journey this week. Focusing on the crossing out method and number problems.

For example: There are 8 sheep in a field, 3 move to a different field, how many will be left? How could I record this?

- I can draw the sheep and cross out the ones that been moved to another field.
- I can complete a cherry model.
- I could even write a number sentence (e.g. $8-3=5$).
- I can make my own subtraction number story and can choose ways to record it.


What the Ladybird Heard

Learning Focus: I can talk about the story of 'What the Ladybird Heard'.

Learning Focus: I can write a sentence about 'What the Ladybird Heard'.

- I can write the word 'map'
- I can write the sentence, 'They had a plan.' Remembering finger spaces and a full stop.
- I could even have a go at writing the story!
- I could find some of the rhyming words in the story and think of other rhyming words to create a rhyming string, eg: hen, pen....
- I could draw a ladybird with a speech bubble next to it. I could write what I think the ladybird is thinking in it.



Phonics/ Spelling

On the Reception page of the Blake School website, you will find the Reception phonics sound order, which details the order we teach sounds. You will also find the sight words list and handwriting phrases.

Your child's third target is to learn how to spell the set 4 sight words **once they are confident with writing sets 1, 2 and 3**. They can begin to learn the fourth set if they are ready. (Extend as necessary for your child. There is no rush to be secure in these.)

This week some of us are learning the 'ng' digraph, and some of us are learning the 'ear' and 'oi' digraphs. Geraldine the giraffe is great fun to watch as a way to consolidate learning. Find the links below:
