This open welcome, underpinned by the constant reinforcement of the value and dignity of every individual, provides the foundation for every member of our community to experience the spirituality that is all around them and within them.

The rhythm of day-to-day patterns within school provide occasions for children to pause and reflect, to ask complex questions and share ideas. Collective Worship, RE and daily reflections, as well as the myriad of opportunities provided by the wider curriculum, enable children to explore and refine their thinking both corporately and as individuals.

The Christian Values, which underpin and shape our life together, provide a vital framework within which all members of our community make informed decisions about how they should live. Reflecting collectively on how to live as a community according to our Values is a deeply spiritual and transformative experience.

Skilled teaching and an emphasis on the provision of quality pastoral care enable children to experience the celebrations and challenges of their lives in safety, as well as to look courageously outward to the complexities of the world around them.
