Back to school 2021

School will be open for next term from Tuesday 5th January 2021.

If you are travelling over the holidays, please be sure to follow the travel advice that is in place and adhere to any quarantine arrangements that are required. Please do let us know if your child will be absent from school because of quarantining.

Children have brought home with them PE kits. Please use the holidays to check that trainers and shoes still fit and that your child still has a complete PE kit. PE will continue to take place outside in January so it is essential that your children have joggers and a warm top as part of their kit.

Please also take the opportunity to top up your child's pencil case contents, pencils and rubbers are often quickly used.

Covid-19

This week we have had a number of positive Covid-19 cases (9 to date), which are all currently confined to staff who have worked within the Reception bubble, or children from that bubble.

It has always been our policy to remain open and transparent with the school community and we have therefore shared with you cases as they have been reported to us.

Over the Christmas holidays however we will only inform you of any new cases where these affect you directly, that is, if your child has been in direct contact with them and are therefore required to isolate.

Please can we remind all our Reception parents that their children must continue to self-isolate <u>i.e. they must not leave the house</u> until 20th December 2020.

If your child does develop any Covid-19 symptoms over the school holidays it is essential that you get them tested. You must report any positive test results to us by email as soon as possible so that we can inform any individuals who would be required to isolate.
