After the success of last year's 'Asylum Sounds' event, Witney Refugee Action are once again planning a local music and arts fundraiser in September. This year it will be happening on Saturday 30th September, again at the Rock Barn in Witney. Musicians, poets, artists and others will take to the stage together with family-friendly arts and crafts, mural painting, cake and street-food stalls, running from 2pm to 11.30pm. All funds raised will go to our continued efforts to support refugees across the world, as well as here in West Oxfordshire, as our group embark on a new initiative to sponsor a refugee family to come to Witney, through the Government's community resettlement scheme. The quilt will be presented to the family we eventually welcome with the funds raised through the event itself.
